James G. Hodge Jr. J.D. LL.M. is an Associate Professor at the Johns Hopkins Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health; an Adjunct Professor of Law at Georgetown University Law Center; Executive Director of the Center for Law and the Public's Health at Georgetown and Johns Hopkins Universities; and a Core Faculty member of the Berman Bioethics Institute at JHSPH.

Through his scholarly and applied work Professor Hodge delves deeply into multiple areas of public health law ethics and human rights. He has drafted (with others) several public health law reform initiatives including the the Model State Emergency Health Powers Act (MSEHPA) and the Turning Point Model State Public Health Act (Turning Point Act).

His diverse funded projects include current and prior work on (1) the legal framework underlying the use of volunteer health professionals during emergencies; (2) state genetics laws and policies; (3) historical and legal bases underlying school vaccination programs (4) international tobacco policy (5) legal and ethical distinctions between public health practice and research; and (5) public health law case studies in VA MI NH OR NE AK MT MI and DE. He is also a national expert on public health information privacy law and ethics.
