Dr. Allen Craig graduated from the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in 1982 and completed a residency in family medicine at the University of Washington in Seattle in 1985. From 1985 to 1995, he served as a practicing clinician at the Shiprock Indian Health Service Hospital on the Navajo Reservation in New Mexico. During his last seven years there, he was hospital Medical Director.

From 1995 until 1997, Dr. Craig was an Epidemic Intelligence Service officer with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, stationed at the Tennessee Department of Health. From 1997-2001 he served as the Deputy State Epidemiologist. Since December 1998, he has been co-Principal Investigator of the Tennessee Emerging Infections Program as well as Assistant Clinical Professor in Preventive Medicine at the Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. In 2001, he was appointed State Epidemiologist and Director of Communicable and Environmental Disease Services at the Tennessee Department of Health. His research interests include emerging infections and vaccine preventable diseases.
