M. Deborah Millette is an epidemiologist serving as the Acting Associate Director for Program Development with the National Center for Environmental Health, Division of Emergency and Environmental Health Services. She has responsibility for program initiatives and serves as the project officer for the Healthy Homes Initiative. She also is assigned to the Office of the Director, National Center for Environmental Health/Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry to coordinate the 2006 National Environmental Public Health Conference to be held in Atlanta on December 4 through 6, 2006. She began her career with CDC in 1994 in the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry's Division of Health Studies, Office of the Director.
