Frederic E. Shaw M.D. J.D. serves as medical officer in the CDC Public Health Law Program. Dr. Shaw was born and reared in Nashua New Hampshire. He received his medical training at the University of Vermont College of Medicine Burlington the State University of New York-Downstate New York City and the Medical Center Hospital of Vermont. He studied law at the Columbia and Harvard law schools and is a member of the New Hampshire Bar. Dr. Shaw is dual board-certified in internal medicine and preventive medicine. Senate Committee on Health Education Labor and Pensions Washington D.C.; and Assistant Health Commissioner for Policy and Planning at the Texas Department of Health Austin. He has also worked in Washington D.C. as a private consultant on managed care immunization food safety and infection control policy. Recently he has worked on global and domestic immunization issues and on the law of public health. His writings include articles on hepatitis control public health and law.
