OVERVIEW

This report lists selected products and services the CDC Public Health Law Program has developed and delivered to state and local public health agencies, their partners, and CDC programs, beginning in 2000. Partnered with the National Association of County and City Health Officials to develop and support national implementation of the “Public Health Preparedness Law Training Curriculum” for local public health officials and legal counsel, 2010-2011

Partnered with the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials to conduct intensive analyses of legal barriers experienced to response, at the state level, to the 2009 A(H1N1) pandemic and to develop and disseminate nationally tools for state public health agencies’ use in addressing those barriers, 2010-2011
